A brief interview, portfolio review and skills test will be conducted. Please <u>bring a copy of your most recent transcript</u> . The skills competition will last approximately one hour. Sign up on your Senior Day web registration.
Art (3-D)	Bart Fetz Room 1110 (Ceramics Lab)	Prepare a portfolio of five to ten <u>original</u> works emphasizing 3-dimensional work (no copy work, please). A brief interview, presentation of work and clay hand building / throwing (student's choice) skills test will be conducted. Please bring a copy of your <u>most recent transcript</u> . The skills test will last approximately one hour. Sign up on your Senior Day web registration. This competition may be done after the other art competition and with only one portfolio.
